

# Everyday Bucket Hat



## Introduction

I design this hat with a shorter and narrower brim. It's more elegant than a usual bucket hat. I crochet this hat from magic circle and work in spiral. It means that you won't see the join line when you finish the hat. You can fold the hat, put it in your bag and wear it everyday!

## Material

### 1. Yarn:

1 skein KnitPicks Dishie Worsted Weight

100% cotton

100 g/3.5 oz each

### 2. Hook:

US size G-6(4mm) crochet hook

### 3. Tools:

1 stitch marker for marking the end of a round

1 tapestry needle for weaving in ends

## Gauge

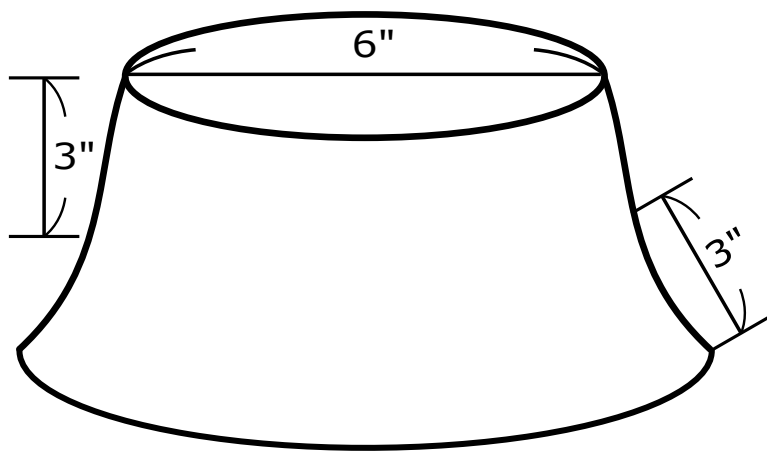
16 sts and 20 rows in sc = 4"

## Skills

- Magic circle
- Single crochet
- Work in spiral

## Abbreviations

- rep: repeat
- rm: remove marker
- rnd: Round
- sc: single crochet
- sl st: slip stitch
- st(s): stitch(es)



## Pattern

**<Place stitch marker into the last stitch to mark the end of the round >**

**<This hat is made in spiral which means that we do not join at the end of the round>**

Rnd 1: Make a magic circle and work 6 single crochet in it. (6st)

Rnd 2: \*2 sc into the same st; rep from\* to the end. (12st)

Rnd 3: \*1 sc into the next st, 2 sc into the next st; rep from \* to the end. (18st)

Rnd 4: \*1 sc into the next 2 st, 2 sc into the next st; rep from \* to the end. (24st)

Rnd 5: \*2 sc into the next st, 1 sc into the next 3 st; rep from \* to the end. (30st)

Rnd 6: \*1 sc into the next 4 st, 2 sc into the next st; rep from \* to the end. (36st)

Rnd 7: \*1 sc into the next 5 st, 2 sc into the next st; rep from \* to the end. (42st)

Rnd 8: \*1 sc into the next 6 st, 2 sc into the next st; rep from \* to the end. (48st)

Rnd 9: \*1 sc into the next 7 st, 2 sc into the next st; rep from \* to the end. (54st)

Rnd 10: \*2 sc into the next st, 1 sc into the next 8 st; rep from \* to the end. (60st)

Rnd 11: \*1 sc into the next 9 st, 2 sc into the next st; rep from \* to the end. (66st)

Rnd 12: \*1 sc into the next 10 st, 2 sc into the next st; rep from \* to the end. (72st)

Rnd 13: \*1 sc into the next 11 st, 2 sc into the next st; rep from \* to the end. (78st)

Rnd 14-23: 1 sc into each st. (78st)

Rnd 24: \*1 sc into the next 12 st, 2 sc into the next st; rep from \* to the end. (84st)

Rnd 25-29: 1 sc into each st. (84st)

Rnd 30: \*1 sc into the next 13 st, 2 sc into the next st; rep from \* to the end. (90st)

Rnd 31-34: 1 sc into each st. (90st)

Rnd 35: \*2 sc into the next st, 1 sc into the next 14 st; rep from \* to the end. (96st)

Rnd 36: \*1 sc into next 5 st, 2 sc into next st, 1 sc into next 10 st; rep from \* to the end (102 st)

Rnd 37: \*1 sc into the next 16 st, 2 sc into the next st; rep from \* to the end. (108st)

Rnd 38: 1 sc into each st. (108st)

Rnd 39: \*1 sc into next st; rep from \* to the last 3 st, sl st into next 3 st, rm, sl st into next 2 st. Fasten off. (108st)

(Optional) Rnd 40: With new yarn, sl st into each st.
